

Peer to Peer Training



This is a great opportunity for you to get involved in Peer Training and Public Speaking. The Tribal Youth / Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) Program will be selecting 10-15 peer trainer's in grades 8- 12th to be trained in a variety of health related topics.

These topics include but are not limited to Meth, Tobacco, Alcohol and Teen Dating Violence. Youth who are selected will receive information on these topics and how they present themselves in our native communities.

Activities will include:

- Media filming
- Acting
- Speakers
- Graphic designers
- Interviewers
- California Conference on American Indian Education (CCAIE) Presentations
- School presentations
- Community Outreach

Peer training is a 10 unit course provided by Tribal Youth Program and OVW staff. After the training is complete each Peer trainer will facilitate one small group presentation at their school or afterschool program and one large group presentation at the California Conference on American Indian Education. For every 10 hours of training a Peer trainer will receive a \$100.00 Gift incentive not to max 40 hours of training and conference presentations.
