- 64 **Councilmember Williams**: We had our Annual Corporations meeting recently. I want to thank
- 65 our Corporations CEOs for their presentations. They did a great job, and we'll continue to
- 66 improve that process. Some of the questions got me thinking, I have been pouring over
- 67 ordinances and policies. A lot of the information comes from the Constitution. It lines out how
- 68 we operate. I also want to talk about why I participated. I took a chance on something I felt
- 69 was necessary for us to do. Something I hear from the people is that they want per-cap, and
- 70 before I was on Council I felt the same way. Once you do the math, for six thousand, five
- 71 hundred people, if we were to give out one thousand dollars. That would take over six and half
- 72 million dollars. I have family who are enrolled Ho-chunk, and that Tribe is about our same size
- about six thousand people. The difference is they have about 5 or 6 casinos. I also liked the idea
- 74 of our corporations being able to provide jobs and revenue. The Tribal membership has a
- chance to hold us accountable every 3 years, if they don't like the job we are doing, they can
- vote us out. In the community I live in I see them at Walmart and Home Depot, and I see our
- 77 younger Tribal members with shopping carts full. It makes me proud.
- 78 **Councilmember Crawford**: Pass.
- 79 **Councilmember Natt**: Pass.
- 80 **Councilmember McCovey**: We just hosted an Offshore Wind Conference and I think it shows
- 81 we have lots of questions. Also, the UIHS Board will be having a meeting with PCR on February
- 82 16th, so if you have any issues with PCR or know anyone with issues with Purchased Referred
- 83 Care (PRC) please email me and I can bring those issues forward. One of things I heard at
- 84 Winter Celebrations was that members are upset about the Culture classes constantly being
- cancelled or there were not enough materials. It's unacceptable, it's not fair for the largest
- 86 District to have miss out, they want to participate. I am not sure if it's a contract thing or what.

- 89 **Councilmember Provolt**: Good morning, I just wanted to give a thank you to some staff who
- 90 came out to my district meeting on a Saturday. Kudos to Barry McCovey, Rosie Clayburn and

- 92 make time to attend this meeting was much appreciated well attended.
