Yurok people can contribute to the tribe instead of this other 120 narrative of what does the tribe do for me type of mindset. So, thinking about different way. 121 We can approach our blood degree and allow our children to be able to be enrolled because we 122 can't keep the blood lines going without interbreeding. So, we've got to think about these 123 things and what we're doing. There's a lot of children, Yurok children, who are descendants that 124 can't get on the roll. They live here, live like Yurok people, and deserve to be on that roll. That's
