Also, if I could get an update on the Head Start's new building in Executive Session 117 that would be appreciated. 118 119 Councilmember Provolt: Pass 120 121 Chairman James: Pass. 122 123 **EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Resignini, Personnel, Incident in Tulley Creek, Head Start building/construction 124 update, and CFMC MOU issue. 125 126 Chairman James recuses himself and asks for Vice Chairman Myers to take over chairing the meeting 127 for Tribal Member Comment. 128 129 TRIBAL MEMBER COMMENT: 130 Shalishah James: Skue yen ue koy, Nek naw Shalishah James, mey who me chok Sregon, esi Hoopa. Ne

131 Chek Aawok Karen Taylor, Nep sech Aawok Jimmie James, Ne cuchas Aawok Josephine James, 132 Ne'peche was Aawok Jimmie Toe James. I am speaking on behalf of Ne Toulas, Patty James. This 133 statement is being read on behalf of Yurok elder Patti James, due to the fact Yurok Tribal Police has not 134 taken a proper statement from her, nor has Humboldt County Sheriff Department as of today July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022. The morning of June 6<sup>th</sup>, around 6am, dogs woke her up by barking approximately two hours. 135 136 During the 8 o'clock hour she was awakened again by gun shots while sleeping in her bed. Startled by 137 this loud noise, a window break, followed by more shots. She got scared and went into the bedroom to 138 only hear a window cracking from top to bottom. She then rushed to the front room, where her 139 daughter, Keyshan Bowen was laying on the couch. She told her the house was shot at and wasn't sure 140 where the shooting was coming from. Once they felt all was clear, Keyshan and Patti walked to 141 property manager, Mike Tyler's home, whom is also a Yurok Tribal Police Officer and YIHA Property 142 Manager, to asl for assistance. After knocking for a while his wife answered the door saying he had 143 COVID-19 so he would not be able to assist and told them to call 911. Keyshan called 911 at 9:07am, 144 twice to report a shooting at the residence to an operator. While waiting for the Sheriff, a black vehicle 145 cruised by, and she could not tell who was driving or recognize the vehicle. Shortly after the window had been shot Tom O'Rourke stooped by approaching Patti and apologizing to her for what happened. 146 147 He stated he was shooting a bear. Her reply was: "you could have killed me". He then tried to hug her 148 at which feeling unsafe, she refused his gesture. Leaving him at her door to go into her home. She then 149 contacted Tashina Henry-James and she came immediately. At which point Tom O'Rourke returned 150 saying it was all an accident, offering a necklace and \$100. He made the statement that if she took the 151 Indian payment, she could not press charges against him. At which she refused payment because she 152 did decide to press charges. Once he realized she was not accepting payment he immediately stated he 153 was going to talk to Joe and resolve this as men should. Once YTP, Officers Tyler Gibson and James 154 Kleinhans arrived around 11am, they seem only to question her name, social security number, phone 155 number and a description of what happened. There was not an investigative initiative of this shooting 156 incident. Mainly she was observed that her neighbors were not questioned by the on-scene officers. 157 Instead, they went to the home of Office Tyler whom did not have knowledge of the incident because 158 he has covid and did not take a statement from her. Patti is concerned because community residents 159 had statements to make as witnesses, why was no one questioned? Furthermore, her concerns of an 160 improper police response are valid. She called 911. She called YTP in Klamath and Klamath Main with 161 no answer. Patti is also concerned about improper investigation into this alleged incident including 162 statements on social media posted on June 8, 2022, a press release made by YTP on Facebook, without 163 a complete Police Report. On the Facebook page, Klamath California Community, comments made by 164 the spouse of YTP Officer Tyler, and I quote "There was no shooting in the Yurok Housing" These 165 comments reaffirm that the welfare and seriousness of this incident and not being handled 166 professionally. This also creates concerns unfairness in the YTPD and possible retaliation from his 167 immediate family. This had caused her mental and emotional anxiety that only id made worse when 168 compounded with her existing health issues. The actions of Thomas O'Rourke reckless behavior have 169 caused her to leave her home for fear of safety and well-being.

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Margo Robbins: I would like to bring to Council's attention the opportunity to grass seed endeavor, we need to expand our prairies. The fires we are doing are opening more and more land for prairies, but we need to plant, and those seeds are not for sale. We could plant them and grow them to sell them. Last week I was collaborating with the Karuk Tribe to purchase more grass seeds, I was trying to reach

- out to Yurok, but because of the MOU and it says that I must go through Rod. That is really problematic for me, I asked to notes forwarded to Will Proctor and Rod said, "Who is that? Does he work for the Yurok Tribe?" I also have asked Rod to reserve Morek Won for meetings and as far as I know that was never done. I didn't mean to use names, I meant to use titles.
