- Inquiry about the old fish hatchery north of Orick and if the Tribe has considered this endeavor.
- There is a new portable bathroom / handwashing unit at Shoreline and want to let YEDC / Raymond Bacon know that it is appreciated.
  - Lastly, members asked if Corporation meetings (YEDC, YAC, etc.) were open to tribal members to attend.

Councilmember Ray: At my last NCIDC, I was notified we haven't been able to finalize getting
the sanitization technicians working yet. We submitted the request for this positions and they
have been approved, NCIDC is just waiting for the Tribe to call them (Brenda) so we can get
these positions in place. It pays \$20 an hour, and we have at least one tribal member
interested. The money is ear marked for the Yurok Tribe. If we don't spend it, it gets sent back. I
had my district meeting, we discussed disc golf, the emergency center building, and we
discussed tribal wide projects. Lots of good ideas came out of that.

Councilmember Natt: I want to back up what Ryan was saying, we really need those sanitization positions. We could really use more people working. Don if you could look into that, especially for Weitchpec offices.

Councilmember Hodge: Good morning, I would like to remind everyone to fill out your ARP application. The sooner you do your paperwork, the sooner you get your check. Thank you very much.

Councilmember Williams: I want to let the membership know that I have been working on a Craft Fair up here (Crescent City) to occur on July 3. I'm trying to help the membership recoup some of the money they lost due to COVID.

Councilmember McCovey: Pass.

Councilmember Vanlandingham: Pass.

James Dunlap, Requa District: There was a couple of items I wanted to bring to the attention of Council in light of the emergency; I would like to have a moratorium put on spending that money until all Districts can have input, and until Annual Membership meeting. I think it would behoove us to see what is being put on the table. Rather than hearing about the things that had been done after the fact. I would hope Council would do that soon. One of the things that going to cost a lot of money in regard to is ever opening a dispensary and contesting the State. And that legal battle will be very expensive. I would like to see a portion put aside for those tribal members who can make it out to the Ocean to go fishing. The catastrophic fish kill that's happening right now, our government contract, the Hoopa Yurok Settlement guaranteed us fish. It's not our responsibility to find where the water comes from, that's the government's problem. If that means a pipeline from the Mississippi River to our Head Waters, then that's what they need to do. We need to hold their feet to the fire. We don't need to negotiate anything short of having fish.
